






These groundbreakers represent all generations, which represent Msgr. Walter's vision: that all ages will enjoy this Rec Center together.


We, as a Church, need to present the opportunity for people to gather.














Fr. Jeff at the Helm 1 April - December, 2021

What it will become. A place to laugh and play together... to experience each other's company in a parish community... people of all ages having fun and making a connection.


This building began as Msgr.'s dream, but it has become ours. You and I have adopted it as our own dream, and it will be all of our legacy as a Parish.
